<u>Types of Tense</u>	There are 3 kinds of Tense.		
<u>Present Tense</u>	Present tense expresses action at the present time.		Tense are verb form which indicate the time of an action
<u>Example</u>	⇒ He eats food. ⇒ They eat food. ⇒ He plays ludo.		
<u>Practice</u>	He writes letter. We eat pizza. I write letter. There are four kinds of Simple Present Tense.	Students are paying attention and grasp the knowledge.	Kinds of Present Tense 1) Present In./ Simple Tense 2) Present Continuous Tense. 3) Present Perfect Tense. 4) Present Perfect Continuous Tense

<u>Present simple Tense</u>	When the subject of the sentence is singular (He, she, it) and with other subjects we add: -s, es or it's to the verb.	Students will pay attention and note it down.	Present Simple Tense
<u>Example</u>	Boys play on the swings. I eat rice.		
<u>Negative Sentence</u>	The negative sentence is formed with: subject + do/does + not + V. ^{1st} form + Object.	Students will pay attention and note it down.	Negative Sentence
<u>Example</u>	He does not eat food. The girl does not play with a ball. I do not eat rice.		
<u>Practice</u>	The baby does not smile. I do not watch T.V.
